

Howard Phillips Lovecraft (August 20th, 1890 – March 15th, 1937) created the iconic Cthulhu Mythos and pioneered the genre of “cosmic horror”—a branch of weird fiction that explores the terrifying indifference of the universe’s supernatural forces towards mankind. Building on the legacy of gothic writers like Edgar Allan Poe, Ambrose Bierce, and the fantasy worlds of Lord Dunsany, Lovecraft’s tales challenge the very nature of reality and humanity’s place within it.

His oeuvre is a vast and inimitable treasury of horror. Lovecraft continues to influence generations of writers, filmmakers, and game designers—from Neil Gaiman and Stephen King to John Carpenter and Ridley Scott. The cult classics of the mythos live on in books, films, comics, and countless video and tabletop games.

This anthology presents five stories of varying lengths—indispensable classics of horror literature alongside lesser-known but equally chilling and thought-provoking gems.
