Annotations

1. Election of officers

In accordance with rule 15 of the rules of procedure of the functional commissions of the Economic and Social Council and past practices, the Statistical Commission, at the commencement of its first meeting of a regular session, shall elect, from among the representatives of its members, a Chairman, three Vice-Chairmen and a Rapporteur (the Bureau).

The Bureau is elected based on the principle of equitable geographical distribution — one member of the Bureau is elected from each of the regions represented on the Commission. The Bureau serves for two years, to the extent possible. This is achieved by electing the Bureau for a period of one year and re-electing those members of the Bureau who continue to be representatives to the Commission at the following session.

2. Adoption of the agenda and other organizational matters

The items on the provisional agenda and the corresponding documentation were proposed by the Commission at its fifty-sixth session (4 - 7 March 2025)¹ and were adopted by the Economic and Social Council in its decision 2025/315. As per that decision, the Bureau of the Commission was entrusted with streamlining and finalizing the agenda. The Bureau has subsequently approved some changes. As previously decided in paragraph (e) of its decision 54/114, the Commission supported the inclusion of three agenda item types in order to streamline the Commission's discussions and decision-making using the limited time effectively, thus, three types of documentation are included in the provisional agenda: for discussion and decision, for decision, and for information. The proposed provisional programme of work and timetable for the session is also before the Commission. The Commission is invited to adopt the agenda and provisional programme of work and timetable for its fifty-seventh session.

3. Items for discussion and decision:

(a) Working methods of the Statistical Commission

The Commission will have before it, for discussion and decision, the report of the Bureau on working methods. The report contains a description of activities undertaken in 2025 pursuant to Statistical Commission decision 56/103. In the report, the Bureau outlines the latest developments and activities under the areas of work tasked to the Bureau such as updates on the development of the Advisory Board on the FPOS and establishment of the working group on data governance as well as assessing the achievement of the objectives of the Economic and Social Council resolutions 2024/2. The report also includes initial considerations regarding AI-readiness of official data and statistics.

The Commission is invited to reflect on the work of the Bureau.

(b) Social and demographic statistics

The Commission will have before it, for discussion and decision, the final report of the Friends of the Chair Group on Social and Demographic Statistics, prepared in accordance with decisions 53/105, 54/104, 55/111, and 56/108. The report outlines the Group's activities and presents its strategic recommendations for strengthening social and demographic statistics, including elevating its role, improving coordination efforts at the global and regional levels, and advancing the development of the proposed central framework for a system of population and social statistics. It also recommends establishing a successor mechanism to implement its strategic recommendations.

The Commission is invited: (a) To approve the recommendations presented in the report, including the establishment of a Committee of Experts on Population and Social Statistics (b) To call on donors and the international community to support the development of the central framework for a system of population and social statistics (c) To dissolve the groups that have completed their mandate in the domain of social

and demographic statistics, including the Friends of the Chair group on social and demographic statistics.

(c) Demographic and housing statistics

The Commission will have before it, for discussion and decision, the report of the Secretary-General on demographic and housing statistics. This report brings to the attention of the Commission selected priority themes in this area: progress in the global implementation of the Degree of Urbanisation methodology; work by UN-Habitat and partners in prioritizing adequate housing for all and strengthening data ecosystems for transformative change in cities; the UN Demographic Yearbook System, a global authoritative source of official national demographic statistics.

The Commission is invited: (a) To encourage all countries to apply the Degree of Urbanisation and produce indicators using its breakdown; (b) Request the development of delineations of urban agglomerations and functional areas with full territorial coverage; (c) Take note of progress on global mapping of slums and informal settlements and recommend the extension of the respective expert group; (d) Take note of work on Quality-of-Life Initiative and implementation of Global Urban Monitoring Framework and endorse further work as specified; and (e) Take note and re-affirm the role of the UN Demographic Yearbook System as an international compendium of official national demographic statistics.

(d) Health statistics

The Commission will have before it, for discussion and decision, the report of the World Health Organization on health statistics. This report notes that despite notable progress in maternal and child health and in reducing the burden of infectious diseases such as HIV and malaria, more than 90% of health-related targets under SDG 3 will remain off track without urgent acceleration. Progress has been impeded by the COVID-19 pandemic, protracted crises and persistent underinvestment in health data systems. Reliable data are indispensable for the early detection of challenges, effective allocation of resources, and strengthened accountability.

The Commission is invited to: (a) Welcome WHO's calls for a renewed global commitment to reinforce domestic health information systems; (b) Acknowledge the use of digital tools and frontier technologies such as Artificial Intelligence in fostering health system strengthening; and (c) Underscore the need for coordinated action across the United Nations system and partners.

(e) National accounts

The Commission will have before it, for discussion and decision, the report of the Intersecretariat Working Group on National Accounts. In the report, the Working Group sets out progress in implementing the 2025 System of National Accounts (2025 SNA), including the preparation of

compilation guidance to support its implementation, and progress on the editing and printing of the 2025 SNA and the post-2025 SNA research agenda. It also contains the programme of work of the Working Group and the regional commissions, and an update on the scope and timeliness of the implementation of the SNA at the country level.

The Commission is invited to express its views and provide guidance on the elements of the programme of work of the Working Group.

(f) Environmental-economic accounting

The Commission will have before it, for discussion and decision, the report of the Committee of Experts on Environmental-Economic Accounting. In the report, the Committee provides information on progress with the update of the System of Environmental Economic Accounting Central Framework, covering the development of guidance notes, outreach activities to inform compilers and users, and coordination with the revision of related economic statistical standards.

The Committee also presents updates on its working groups on coordination and communication, methodological development, development of global databases, and implementation and statistical capacity-building. It further reports on activities of related groups and progress in the implementation of the Statistics Division's project on compiling indicators for the biodiversity monitoring framework.

The Commission is invited to express its views and provide guidance on the progress of work related to the update of the System of Environmental-Economic Accounting Central Framework, as well as on the broader work programme on environmental accounting, as described in the report.

(g) Agricultural and rural statistics

The Commission will have before it, for discussion and decision, the report of the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO) on recent developments in agricultural and rural statistics. This report provides updates on FAO's Strategy for the Modernization of Statistics, key capacity development programs in the areas of agriculture and rural statistics, as well as the launch of the World Census of Agriculture (WCA) 2030 guidelines. It also provides an update on the development of guidelines for Agricultural Science and Technology Indicators (ASTI), the work of the UN Committee of Experts on agricultural and rural statistics (UN-CEAG), and a synthesis of the recommendations of FAO's Regional Commissions on Agricultural Statistics.

The Commission is invited to: (a) Express its views and to provide guidance on the elements of recent developments in agricultural and rural statistics and (b) Endorse the WCA 2030 guidelines, the ASTI guidelines, and the new program of work of the UN-CEAG.

(h) Business and trade statistics, business registers and service statistics

The Commission will have before it, for discussion and decision, the joint report of the Committee of Experts on Business and Trade Statistics, the Wiesbaden Group on Business Registers, and the Voorburg Group on Service Statistics. The report describes the activities of the Committee of Experts, the Wiesbaden Group, and the Voorburg Group over the past year, including the finalization of updated guidance on international merchandise and trade in services statistics and the 2nd volume of the Manual on the Principal Indicators for Business and Trade Statistics.

The Commission is invited to: (a) Endorse the International Merchandise Trade Statistics, Concepts and Definitions (IMTS 2026); (b) Endorse the Manual on Statistics of International Trade in Services (MSITS 2026); (c) Endorse the 2nd volume of the Manual on the Principal Indicators for Business and Trade Statistics (d) Support the establishment of the Task Team on Industry Statistics under the Committee of Experts and endorse its terms of reference, (e) express its views on research topics on the revision of the industry statistics manual and on the progress of the global initiative on unique identifiers for businesses; (f) Support the development of the handbook on business statistics; and (g) Take note of the past activities and provide guidance on the elements of the work programme of the Committee of Experts, Wiesbaden Group and Voorburg Group.

(i) Environment and climate change statistics

The Commission will have before it, for discussion and decision, the report of the Secretary-General on environment and climate change statistics. The report provides an overview of the consolidated work programme conducted by the Statistics Division in collaboration with the restructured Expert Group on Environment and Climate Change Statistics. The programme is coordinated by its Steering Group and supported by the subgroups on climate change questions for censuses and surveys, and on climate and health statistics, as well as related processes. The report describes the outcomes of the twelfth meeting of the Expert Group and contains updates on communication and coordination, data collection and on the implementation of the Global Set of Climate Change Statistics and Indicators and on the Framework for the Development of Environment Statistics. Improvements to methodologies for climate and health indicators are presented and needs for capacity development are highlighted.

The Commission is invited to express its views on the work programme of the restructured Expert Group on Environment and Climate Change Statistics as reflected in its updated terms of reference

(j) Data governance

The Commission will have before it, for discussion and decision, the report of the Working Group on Data Governance. Established by the Statistical Commission at its fifty-sixth session in 2025, the Group aims to advance a shared understanding of data governance and promote coherent approaches across national statistical systems. The report presents the preliminary findings of the 2025 Survey on Data Governance and the National Statistical System, covering institutional arrangements, legal and policy frameworks, the use of new data sources and technologies, and related challenges in coordination, capacities, and international cooperation. The Commission is invited to take note of the Group's working modalities and express its views on the preliminary survey findings and the proposed way forward which will include a detailed analysis of the survey's results and recommendations for action based on that analysis.

(k) Data and indicators for the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development

The Commission will have before it, for discussion and decision, the joint report of the Inter-agency and Expert Group on Sustainable Development Goal Indicators (IAEG-SDGs) and the High-level Group for Partnership, Coordination and Capacity-Building for Statistics for the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development (HLG-PCCB). The report provides a summary of activities undertaken in 2025 by the two groups, including: a) tier classification updates and indicator refinements of the global SDG indicator framework; b) activities of the IAEG-SDGs working groups and task teams on lessons learned; c) preparations for the sixth United Nations World Data Forum (UNWDF) and evaluation plans; and d) implementation of the Medellin Framework for Sustainable Development Data and outcomes from the fourth Financing for Development Conference (FfD4).

The Commission is invited to: (a) Approve the work programmes of both groups for 2026; (b) approve of the indicator refinements; (c) Express its view on the task team on lessons learned; (d) Express its views on the preparations for the 6th UNWDF; and (e) Endorse the strategy for implementing the Medellin Framework and the outcomes of the FfD4.

The Commission will also have before it, for discussion and decision, the report of the Secretary-General on the work by the Statistics Division, in cooperation with other entities of the United Nations system, in support of the 2030 Agenda. The report describes the preparation of the annual report of the Secretary-General on the progress towards the Sustainable Development Goals (A/80/81-E/2025/62), the work to update the Global Sustainable Development Goal Indicators Database and provides updates on: (a) the Data for Now initiative; (b) the Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E) Framework for the Antigua and Barbuda Agenda for SIDS (ABAS); (c) the collaborative on the use of administrative data for statistical purposes; (d) the Global Network of Institutions for Statistical Training; (e) the Global Network of Data Officers and Statisticians; (f) the work of the Intersecretariat Working Group on Household Surveys; and (g) the work on citizen data.

The Commission is invited to take note of and express its views on the work carried out by the Statistics Division, in cooperation with the United Nations system, in support of the 2030 Agenda in the above areas.

(l) Well-being measurement

The Commission will have before it, for discussion and decision, the report of the Expert Group on Well-being Measurement. The Statistical Commission decision 55/108 endorsed the creation of the Expert Group on Well-being Measurement (EGWM)) to take forward recommendations to produce a Framework of Inclusive and Sustainable Well-being (FISW) guidance document (E/CN.3/2024/10). Pursuant to decision 56/111 of the Statistical Commission, the EGWM reports directly to the Statistical Commission). This report provides an overview of the EGWM's membership, its collaborative working with other organizations and experts, its delivery of its 2025 programme of work, and the proposed 2026 programme of work.

The Statistical Commission is invited to: (a) Express its views on the Expert Group's activities in 2025, (b) Endorse its work programme for 2026, and (c) endorse with the distribution of draft chapters of the FISW for global consultation in 2026-27.

(m) Presentation of statistical data and metadata, dissemination of statistics and open data

The Commission will have before it, for discussion and decision, the report of the Secretary-General on presentation of statistical data and metadata, dissemination of statistics through the Statistics Division and its publications, and open data. This report provides an overview of the work on open data and data dissemination carried out by the UN Statistics Division in 2024-25, in collaborative efforts with its partners. It encompasses activities to implement the work plan approved by the UN Statistical Commission at its 55th session, including methodological advancements, data and metadata dissemination activities, and capacity-building endeavours in relation to the dissemination of data and metadata for official statistics. The Statistical Commission is invited to review and provide input on the activities.

(n) Statistical capacity development

The Commission will have before it, for discussion and decision, the report of the Secretary-General on statistical capacity development. The report draws upon, among others, on the outcomes of the 2025 United Nations Statistical Commission's Seminar on Emerging Issues, titled "*Capacity Development for Relevant, Resilient, and Agile National Statistical Systems: Are We on the Right Track?*". The report situates statistical capacity development within the broader framework of system-wide approaches to capacity development. It presents an overview of capacity development activities carried out by the Statistics Division since 2023 to support national statistical systems and contains proposals for strengthening coordination and improving modalities

to ensure more coherent, long-term support to national statistical systems. The Commission is invited to express its views on the work carried out and the proposals for improvement.

(o) Regional statistical development

The Commission will have before it, for discussion and decision, the report of the Economic and Social Commission for Western Asia (UNESCWA). The report documents substantial progress in the Arab region toward advancing official statistics and modernizing national statistical systems aligned with global standards. It highlights efforts to strengthen institutional, technological, and human capacities for producing high-quality, timely, and comparable statistics across economic, social, demographic, and environmental domains. Priority actions include implementing the System of National Accounts 2025 (SNA 2025), with emphasis on digitalization, well-being, and sustainability, transitioning to register-based censuses and strengthening CRVS, integrating geospatial and digital technologies, and applying AI and data science to improve production and dissemination (e.g., interactive dashboards and data portals) and to address conflict-related data gaps. The report also underscores commitments to digital transformation and data innovation through enhanced coordination, expanded partnerships, a regional one-stop data portal, and wider use of SDMX and the MARS platform to support SDG monitoring and reporting aligned with the global indicator framework, including disaggregation by sex and disability.

The Commission is invited to take note of and express its views on the progress achieved through strengthened regional collaboration among countries and with the United Nations system.

(a) Ageing-related statistics and age-disaggregated data

The Commission will have before it, for decision, the report of the Titchfield Group on Ageing-Related Statistics and Age-Disaggregated Data. This report provides a review and update of the work undertaken by the Group since March 2024, including publications and activities. It also provides a summary of progress achieved over the seven-year duration of the Group, along with reflections on its challenges and successes.

The Commission is invited to: a) Take note of the Group's work and publications; b) Acknowledge the conclusion of its activities; and c) Formally dissolve the Titchfield Group.

(b) Refugee, internally displaced persons and statelessness statistics

The Commission will have before it, for decision, the report of the Expert Group on Refugee, Internally Displaced Persons and Statelessness Statistics, which contains a request for an extension of the Group's terms of reference to consolidate achievements and address emerging priorities.

The report presents progress in implementing the International Recommendations on Refugee Statistics (IRRS), the International Recommendations on Internally Displaced Persons Statistics (IRIS), and the International Recommendations on Statelessness Statistics (IROSS) that were endorsed by the Commission in 2018, 2020 and 2023 respectively, alongside other achievements of the Group. The report underscores the imperative of continued international collaboration to strengthen national statistical systems and advance statistical harmonization. Taken together, this work represents collaborative efforts to improve the quality and availability of national statistics on key vulnerable groups that facilitate evidence-based and inclusive policy development in line with the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, the Global Compact on Refugees, the UN Action Agenda on Internal Displacement, and the Global Alliance to End Statelessness.

The Commission is invited to review and endorse the revised terms of reference of the Expert Group and to approve its future work priorities.

(c) Disaster-related statistics

The Commission will have before it, for decision, the report of the Inter-Agency and Expert Group on Disaster-Related Statistics (IAEG-DRS). In the report, the draft Global Disaster-Related Statistics Framework (G-DRSF) is presented, which incorporates inputs from a global consultation and annual Global Expert Fora for Producers and Users of Disaster-related Statistics. The report identifies the need to strengthen disaster-related statistics for global, regional and national policy frameworks, including the Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction, and harmonizes disaster-related statistics with other official statistical frameworks. The report also contains a summary of activities conducted by IAEG-DRS pursuant to Statistical Commission decision 50/116, including the process for development of the G-DRSF.

The Commission is invited to endorse the draft G-DRSF as the global statistical framework underpinning the production of disaster-related statistics and provide guidance to the IAEG-DRS on future efforts to strengthen disaster-related statistics and implement the G-DRSF.

(d) Governance statistics

The Commission will have before it, for decision, the report of the Praia Group on Governance Statistics. The Group provides a review of activities and accomplishments since 2024, particularly the methodological work carried out by the task teams on non-discrimination and equality and on participation in political and public affairs, to develop internationally harmonized survey modules and guidance on the

use of administrative data sources for producing internationally comparable statistics on these two sub-domains of governance statistics. The Commission is invited to: (a) endorse the four methodological tools developed by the task teams, namely: the Survey on Discrimination, the Survey on Participation in Political and Public Affairs, the Guidance on Utilizing Electoral Administrative Data to Produce Statistics on Inclusive Political Participation, and Using Administrative Data to Measure Non-Discrimination and Equality: Guidance for National Statistical Offices; (b) support the continuation of the Praia Group on Governance Statistics and its work under the proposed revised terms of reference; and (c) express its views on possible future directions of work in the domain of governance statistics beyond 2025, within the framework of the revised CSA 2.0.

(e) International statistical classifications

The Commission will have before it, for decision, the report of the Committee of Experts on International Statistical Classifications. The report presents the Committee's work on the revision of the Classification of Statistical Activities (CSA), the Standard International Energy Product Classification (SIEC), and the Classification of the Functions of Government, and its work on the maintenance of the International Standard Industrial Classification of All Economic Activities (ISIC) and Central Product Classification (CPC). It also presents the Committee's activities in coordinating work on other classifications proposed for the Commission's adoption.

The Commission is invited to: (a) endorse the CSA Version 2.1; (b) endorse the Extended Balance of Payment Services Classification 2026; (c) endorse the International Statistical Classification on Alternative Care of Children; (d) endorse the International Classification of Dying Places; (e) endorse the structure of the SIEC Version 2.0; and (f) support the revision of the International Recommendations for Energy Statistics in connection with the development of the revised SIEC.

(f) Integration of statistical and geospatial information

The Commission will have before it, for decision, the report of the Expert Group on the Integration of Statistical and Geospatial Information. In its report, the Group provides information on its recent activities to strengthen the integration of statistical and geospatial information, including: (a) the issuance of the *second edition of the Global Statistical Geospatial Framework (GSGF)*; (b) the paper *The Benefits of the UN Integrated Geospatial Information Framework for the Statistical Domain*, showcasing opportunities for interoperability with National Geospatial Information Agencies; and (c) its *Strategic Plan and Vision for 2030*. The Commission is invited to take note of the work, endorse the second edition of the Global Statistical Geospatial Framework, and provide guidance upon the Group's future direction.

The Commission will have before it, for information, the report of the Secretary-General on gender statistics, providing a summary of recent activities undertaken by the United Nations Statistics Division and the Inter-Agency and Expert Group on Gender Statistics (IAEG-GS) to strengthen gender data to support progress towards gender equality and SDG monitoring. (d) Economic statistics

(e) International Comparison Programme

The Commission will have before it, for information, the report of the World Bank on International Comparison Programme (ICP). The report summarizes activities undertaken in 2025 at the global, regional, and national levels on the use of the 2021 results and implementation of the 2024 cycle. It highlights progress in governance, capacity building, and methodological development, including digital and AI-enabled tools to improve the quality and timeliness of price data collection and to monitor the use and impact of purchasing power parities (PPPs). The report also notes the establishment of the Task Force on Annual PPP Production, to enhance the policy relevance and responsiveness of PPPs, and the Task Force on the ICP Classification Update, to strengthen alignment and synergies between the ICP and consumer price statistics.

The Commission is invited to take note of these developments, and stakeholders are called upon to provide the necessary resources and institutional support to accelerate innovations and ensure the sustainability of the Programme as a permanent element of the global statistical system.

(f) Information and communications technology statistics

The Partnership underscores the urgent need for new statistical indicators to monitor emerging trends in the digital economy and society, including the use of artificial intelligence (AI) and the environmental impacts of ICT development. It also highlights the growing demand for data to monitor universal and meaningful connectivity (UMC). Recognizing that reliable ICT statistics are vital for policymaking, the Partnership stresses the importance of sustainable financing for data collection, particularly ICT surveys by national statistical offices. The report also presents new and revised indicators on ICT in employment, AI use, e-waste, and greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions from the ICT sector. The Commission is invited to take note of the report.
